INTRODUCING THE COMPUTER TO PRE-SCHOOLERS

Sonokids is an organization dedicated to the development of innovative, educational computer programs that are accessible and fun for young blind or visually impaired children. Many of Sonokid's Ballyland computer games are designed to introduce children to keyboarding skills on the desktop or laptop, as well as books and games that are

interactive on mobile touch screen devices such as the ipad. For example, the interactive audio e-book "Stay Still, Squeaky!" utilizes narration, song and sound effects which encourage the child to interact with the story via the touch screen. Learn more at Ballyland.com.



INEXPENSIVE COMPUTERS

Computers for the Blind offers laptop and desktop computers to the blind and visually impaired for a minimal price. Desktops (with monitor, keyboard and mouse) are available for \$110 and laptops for \$160. The computers come loaded with Windows 7, a demo version of JAWS (screen reader software), NVDA (screen reader), MAGic, a screen magnification program, TypeAbility, a demo version of a typing tutorial. Upgrades from demo versions to licensed versions of any of the software are available at a discount from Freedom Scientific.
